


Karlskrona 1988

We are now ready to recieve the IFR 2012 guests in Hundested. There are still some "late" registrations, but they shall be welcome. As it is now there will be 40 boats, and 4 "crews" without boat. 8 NL, 6 D, 5 S, 3 UK, 1 USA, 1 LT, and 20 DK. 93 persons. We look foreward to see you all in Hundested and we will do our best to make it a good exprience. I will supply "Information for Sailors" (navy's shooting north of Sjaelland and other things of interest.) Just write me ingper@gmail.com or give me a call when you are here: +4528344703.

Some of you intend to sail along the danish westcoast and through Limfjord, as I was told. It can be a very nice experience, but you have to be aware of the waves and the current when you enter the ports of Hvide Sande (VHF canal 12/16) and Thorsminde(VHF canal 13/16). It can be very rough and it may be a good idea for you to contact the harbour, before entering.

The railwaybridge in Aalborg should be open after the collision with a finnish freighter.

The other way through the inner danish waters is more smooth. The route through Storebaelt is the shortest, only few NM shorter than the one through Lillebaelt, but you have to be aware of the tall ships route T when you cross. The big ships go with a speed of about 25 knots, so they are suddenly there. The route through Lillebaelt is more calm and cosy.

If you have songs that need to be sung, then write the text to me, and I wil print it together with the songs we find, and if you are a musician then bring your instrument.






# IFR 1988 Karlskrona/Sweden


